Welcome To Monmouth County

Training Intervention ProcedureS - TIPS

Safe Alcohol UseThis Summer

- Know your limits.
- Appoint a designated driver or plan for alternate transportation.
- Hydrate between drinks, and be mindful of the heat.

Help Prevent an Overdose While at Bars & Restaurants

- Train bartenders and servers on how to administer Narcan.
- Display print materials that identify the signs of an overdose in restrooms.



MOTELS/HOTELS/AIR BNB



OVERDOSES COMMONLY OCCUR IN HOTEL/MOTEL ROOMS. HERE'S HOW YOU CAN BE PREPARED:

- Stock Narcan in hotel/motel/air bnb bathrooms and advertise with amenities information.
- Provide Monmouth County Substance Use Resource Directories and recovery service materials in each room.
- Train hotel/motel staff and air bnb property managers in Narcan administration.
- Hang educational flyers in each hotel/motel room or air bnb identifying the signs of an overdose.
- Place phone number for "Never Use Alone" by room telephones 800-484-3731 for English | 800-928-5330 for Spanish.

Naloxone (brand name Narcan) is now available free of charge to anyone 14 years or older in New Jersey at participating pharmacies (No ID or prescription required).

Why is carrying naloxone important?



Since 2018, tens of thousands of New Jerseyans have experienced an overdose and more than 15,000 died of a suspected drug-related death.

Narcan immediately reverses an opioid overdose, dramatically increasing the chance for survival while ultimately improving the odds for future recovery.
